3-The first word would never accept tanwien because it is definite

4-The case ending of the first word depends on its position in the sentence.

Idafa Structure

Two or more nouns added to each other to express possessives. It is an alternative structure to (of) or ('s) structures in English.

The first word usually belongs to the second one.

1- قلم الولد

2- سيارة المدرس

3- صورة فتاةٍ

4- كتب المهندسين

5- أكواب المهندسيين

6- سيارتا المصنع

7- مهندسو المصنع

<u>1-The last word</u> is called Mudaf Ilieh مُضنَاف إليه

2-The last word can start with $\ \ \, \ \ \, \ \ \,$

3-The last word can end with Tanween if it is indefinite.

4-The case ending of the last word is always genitive.

5-The 5 has to be pronounced clearly as a regular $\stackrel{.}{\hookrightarrow}$ if it comes at the end of the first words.

6-If <u>the first word</u> is Dual or Sound Masculine Plural the ending ن must be dropped.
